At Upper Yarra Secondary College, we operate with three Sub Schools: Junior (7 - 8) Middle (9 -10) and Senior (11 - 12).

Junior and Middle School staff take great care in managing and supervising all aspects of the College at Years 7, 8, 9 and 10. This includes curriculum planning and delivery, welfare support and referrals, student management, events and strategic direction.

It is our aim to ensure your child has a productive, enriching education targeted to extending their abilities within a happy and safe environment.

Day to day management is conducted by Support teachers, who are supported by their Team Leaders, who are in turn supported by their Sub School Leaders.

We offer excellent programs at Upper Yarra using innovative approaches to learning, such as the BYOD Program, FLIP (Future Learners Inquiry Program), Education Perfect, and S.T.E.A.M. electives (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Maths). (Inquiry learning allows students to progress at the speed and direction best suited to them.)

We understand the importance of a successful transition for all students, particularly those from small schools. The UYSC Assisted Transition Programs are designed to help students overcome anxieties, familiarise themselves with, and answer any questions they may have about secondary school.

Primary students are given the opportunity to meet future classmates and develop early friendships they can carry over to the following year. Furthermore, it provides UYSC Staff with the opportunity to meet and get to know students and identify any educational, social or emotional needs individuals may have. We have been operating these programs alongside each other for several years and have seen a significant improvement in the outcomes of our Year 7 students since their introduction.

TRANSFORMATIONS PROGRAM

This program allows for students to make the best start to Year 7 as possible. Students attend UYSC for two half days prior to Orientation Day, giving them the opportunity to experience life as a secondary school student.

Primary schools are invited to select those students to attend whom they feel will benefit most from the program.

TRANSITION VISITS

We also operate a Transition Program amongst our local Primary Schools in which all students in years 5 and 6 visit the College and undertake a curriculum area which is also supported in their classrooms.

An important part of the experience is dealing with real life scenarios for secondary students, such as reading timetables and using lockers.





The goal of FLIP is to engage our Year 7 and Year 8 students in a personalised, challenging curriculum. Participation in FLIP allows students to acquire and practise skills that assist them across the curriculum, throughout their secondary schooling and beyond.

It is based on research that shows students learn better when they are interested and keen to participate in programs that are spread across learning areas, rather than single subjects. FLIP is our Inquiry Based Learning program, which was introduced in 2012 as a result of this research.

This highly structured program is team-taught by a small group of teachers and allows students to collaborate across the year level.



FLIP combines skills and content from English, The Arts and Humanities (Geography and History).

There is a strong focus on literacy (reading, writing and research skills) and on the fostering of student choice and creativity.

FLIP provides students with a range of creative ways to showcase their learning.







The Senior School at UYSC is responsible for all programs relating to Years 11 and 12. Our aim is to prepare and support students throughout their VCE, VETiS or VCE VM program, to ensure they have a positive transition into further education or employment.

Each year level has a specific team of staff to manage and supervise all aspects of students at their year level as well as a Senior School Leader (managing VET and Pathways/Careers) and a VCE VM Coordinator.

Students are strongly encouraged to be involved in all aspects of school life and to keep a healthy balance of school, study, part-time work, sport and leisure activities.

CAREERS

Year 10, 11 and 12 are important decision-making times when students are required to select a course and choose their future directions.

One-on-one career counselling begins in Year 10 to coincide with their Work Experience Program and Civics and Citizenship classes. These sessions continue in Year 11 and 12 ensuring that students are selecting subjects relevant to their future goals.

PATHWAYS

SPORT HOUSES


Upon enrolment, students are placed into one of four sport houses. Families are allocated into the same house. The house allocation will last for the duration of your child's time at the school.









WHAT IS STEAM?

STEAM – Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics – covers a wide range of disciplines and skills, which are increasingly in demand in our rapidly changing world. STEAM skills and knowledge are important for all stages of our learning, jobs and everyday lives. STEAM education develops critical and creative thinking, collaboration and ethical decision making.

WHAT WILL MY CHILD LEARN?

STEAM is a hands-on approach that combines concepts from Science, Arts, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. It focusses on the development of our students into innovators with the technological skills to solve problems and is linked closely with Inquiry Learning. Using a range of tools, equipment, 3D printers, robots, circuits, gears, motors, electronics, plastics and timber, students use design, computational and innovative thinking and technology to solve real world problems.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

UYSC is currently offering DRONES – Certificate III in Aviation (RePL – Remote Pilot Licence). It develops the knowledge and skills required by individuals seeking to operate remotely piloted aircraft systems (RPAS) within visual line of sight (VLOS). Successful completion of this qualification may provide Career opportunities for students as a UAV operator within a range of roles in various sectors, for example, in agriculture, surveying, infrastructure, emergency services or aerial imagery.



Students at Upper Yarra Secondary Conegestudy Japanese. The study of a second language contributes to the overall education of students in the areas of communication and cross-cultural understanding.

Beginning in Year 7, students study Japanese language and culture. They explore the differences and similarities between life in Japan and Australia and learn to communicate in Japanese.

Students study the three types of Japanese scripts: Kanji, Hiragana and Katakana; and learn how to read and write the 46 Hiragana characters as well as some Kanji. Counting to 100 and using numbers in a range of situations is also studied.





Student literacy is prioritised at UYSC. The school has a documented, whole school, literacy plan developed by the Literacy Team at UYSC.

INDEPENDENT READING WORKSHOP

Years 7, 8 and 9 English Classes (CAFÉ model). During Independent Reading Workshop, all Year 7 to 9 English students are explicitly taught a range of reading strategies. They read books of their own choice and set individual and class reading goals with their teacher.

WRITING TO LEARN (WTL)

All UYSC teachers use a range of WTL strategies to deepen student thinking about their learning. There are many types of WTL strategies and they are used at different stages of the learning process. Some examples of strategies teachers currently use are: Double Entry Journals, Writing Break, Nonstop Write, Coding when Reading, and many more.

GRADUAL RELEASE OF RESPONSIBILITY

GRR is a teaching and learning process used across the school.

The key elements include:

- Learning intentions and success criteria
- Mini lesson explicit teaching and modelling
- Work time, including conferring
- Catch opportunity for clarification
- Debrief/Reflection


NUMERACY

The Numeracy Program at Upper Yarra Secondary College promotes the development of mathematical skills and knowledge that is applicable and usable in the real world.

The program consists of two components, 'Mathematical Skills in Life' and 'Mathematical Skills in Work'. In the first unit of the course students become familiar with and further develop their skills and understanding of the mathematical concepts that are important in everyday life, such as budgeting, time, timetables and percentages. Whilst in the second unit of the course, students begin to investigate how maths is used in different aspects of the work force.

Students spend time learning the maths in a range of different industries and then finish with a project based around their intended career pathway.





At UYSC, all students are given the opportunity to challenge themselves and achieve success. A range of extension and intervention programs are available to students across all years at the College.

IN THE CLASSROOM

Individual learning programs and goal setting:

Students work one on one with a teacher to set individual goals for a subject or across learning areas.

Inquiry Learning:

Students focus on their own areas of interest within a topic, where they are supported to take their learning to a deeper level.

Growth Mindset Education:

Teaching students to understand how their brains work and how it is possible for everyone to achieve success with a growth, rather than a fixed mindset.



WIDER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Yarra Ranges Tech Schools Partnerships:

Students are given the opportunity to access programs and opportunities in a range of areas including STEM education as well as make local industry connections.

Student Voice:

Membership on UYSC School Council and an active SRC program allows students to access leadership opportunities and develop their leadership capabilities.

VCE Fast Tracking:

Available for year 10 students who are ready to begin their VCE program.

University Enhancement Programs:

For students who are ready to experience university education while completing their VCE.

Victorian High Abilities Program:

Delivered by Virtual School Victoria, the Victorian High-Ability Program consists of an intensive tenweek online course in Mathematics and English. Selected students in Years 7 and 8 participate in this exciting new challenge and extension program.

EXTERNAL PARTNERSHIPS

Deakin University and the LEAP program include a range of programs both at University and at school to expose students to a range of career pathways and familiarise them with University life.



LITERACY

Literacy is aimed at students requiring extra support with the development of their literacy skills. In smaller classes, students focus on improving their skills in reading, writing and comprehension.

Students learn to use and apply reading strategies, enabling them to access and understand different text types.


Students complete a variety of writing and vocabulary activities, designed to improve their ability to write for all subject areas.

Literacy aims to incorporate students' personal interests, as a way of engaging students while improving their skills in literacy.

AFTER-SCHOOL CLASSES

After-School classes provide students with the opportunity to get free additional help in Mathematics and English. They currently run each week in the afternoon (excluding the first and last week of term) from 3.15pm to 4.30pm.

A different teacher is available each week to assist your child with their school work.



All students are better prepared for learning when they are healthy, happy and feel safe. Student wellbeing is therefore the responsibility of all staff. Support Teachers and Year Level Leaders all provide support, encouragement and monitor the daily wellbeing of students. Together we aim to provide a positive, supportive environment for each student to maximise their educational potential.

THE WELLBEING TEAM


At UYSC, an early intervention approach includes implementing appropriate support programs and the provision of school-based counselling.

Our approach aims to be sensitive to students' feelings and needs, improving resilience, utilising specialist services where appropriate and restoring wellbeing and preparedness to learn.

We have School Counsellors, a School Nurse, a range of Allied Health Professionals such as Social Workers, Educational Psychologists and a School Chaplain, who all assist students as needed.

DOCTORS IN SCHOOLS

Each Friday UYSC delivers a comprehensive health and wellbeing service to students via the Doctors in Schools Program. Teenagers are the least likely of all age groups to seek health care, and many health problems that can have consequences into adulthood, start at this time of life. This program seeks to address this issue, and provide a convenient alternative to primary care during schools hours. All GPs have had adolescent health training and provide students with the same services normally provided by GPs in the community.
